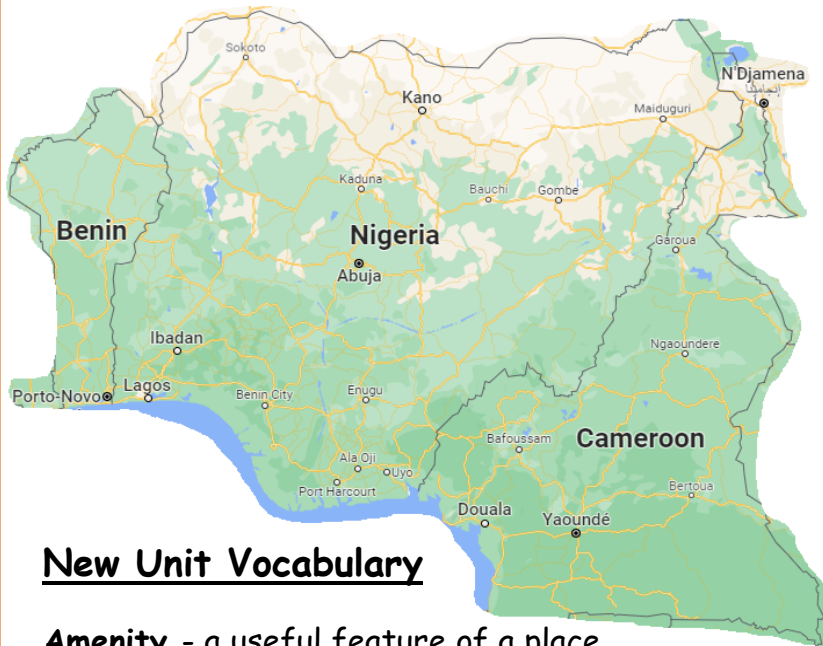

Primary Focus - Locational Knowledge

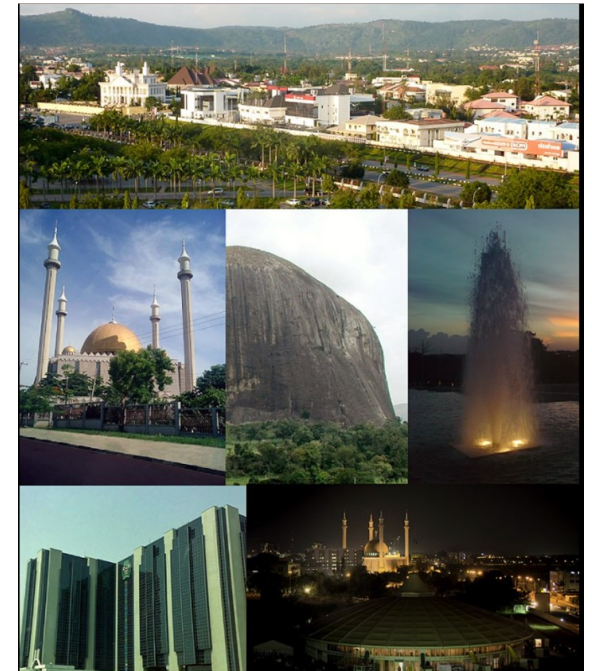
In this unit, Year 2 will learn
